GUESTS:

- Haley Wilton stated she had concerns with the new owners of the Cone Barn. The husband of the couple; Terry Heltsley being a convicted sex offender. Haley is concerned of him being even on the deed of the Cone Barn due to this town being surrounded by children. Haley stated have a lot of sports in this town and a lot of kids could come into contact with Terry Heltsley. Haley asked if there is anything citizens can do. Attorney Lading stated there are on going conversations taking place and we are addressing this issue.
- Richard Nolan asked if the mayor shops at Wal-mart, Schuncks, etc. and how do you know there aren't sex offenders shopping. Richard Nolan asked when do they get a second chance in life. Mayor Reynolds stated point taken.

- Brenda Nolan stated it's no different than someone drinking and driving. Brenda stated she doesn't understand why the wife just can't run the Cone Barn.
- Kim Warren stated but they are selling ice cream to children.
- Terry Hogan stated she is the wife of Terry Heltsley and she's the one over there every day by herself. Anyone is welcome to come over and see who's inside the building. Terry Hogan said she's been keeping the doors locked because she doesn't know what will happen to her.
- Mayor Reynolds stated this is being researched and will make sure the laws are enforced.
- Brenda Nolan stated why can't her daughter-n-law have a second chance. People are harassing her and not letting her do that.
- Kim Warren stated she has submitted an email to all the board members and would like everyone to review it. Mayor Reynolds stated he hasn't been getting much support for a dog park at the water tower site. Mayor Reynolds would like to set up a meeting with Kim and discuss this further.
- Kim Warren stated she has an issue with derelict vehicles. She has one by her house and it's been there awhile. Maybe get the Community involved to help.
- Brenda Nolan stated this doesn't have anything to do with Roxana but who in the world is supposed to clean up South Roxana? It's the junkiest town I have seen in my life. Can't they make them clean up their yards?
- Mr. David Phillips who resides at 310 Doerr Street wanted to compliment the Roxana Police Department. He goes jogging at odd hours and he will see a Police Officer come by and they wave. It makes him feel safe. Occasionally they will stop and ask him questions. It is very comforting to have them around. A couple months ago a Police Officer was just going by doing rounds and saw a small fire and was able to catch it before it got out of control. He is grateful and blessed for our Roxana Officer's.

MAYOR COMMENTS:

- Mayor Reynolds and Chief Trask met with the Roxana Landfill Authority and a
 group called Amerostoe last Wednesday. They are wanting to build a Green
 Energy Plant Gas Plant on the landfill property. Daryl is researching some of the
 concerns.
- Mayor Reynolds received annexation request from the Bertles family.
- Mayor Reynolds said we received the survey on Hedge Road, the drainage project.

DEPARTMENT HEADS:

Chief Cunningham provided the following:

- Chief Cunningham submitted the ECF Relief Fund Application for Police/Fire/Public Services/EMS. The cost for the in car and portable radio upgrade to digital is \$13,547.88.
- The police department is participating with Mid-States Organized Crime Information Center (MOCIC) which is funded through the Department of Justice. Our cost is \$100 per year, and we receive a multitude of services, equipment, and intelligence gathering services. We met with our area's Coordinator and received our activation and training.
- Lt. Doyle is scheduled to return on Wednesday, April 13th.

Fire Chief Trask provided the following:

• Chief Trask stated his grant application was also submitted last week.

Superintendent Brian Sherer provided the following:

- Spoke with Hydro-Kinetics and he is still working on getting us a quote for new dialers for water/waste-water.
- Also stated Hydro-Kenetics has been in contact with Horner (Company who manufactures the SCADA Controllers) about the unit in for repair. They are doing testing and replaced some components but it's under warranty.
- Spoke with Eric with IMCO and the estimated time for delivery for the fire hydrant replacement barrel is mid-May.
- Spoke with Dana Heck, from Brotcke Well and Pump Company and they did pump test this past fall. Dana has reviewed everything, and we shouldn't need any maintenance to our wells this year.

Superintendent Ken Hoxsey provided the following:

- Still looking to get action for dumpsters.
- Received a quote from RCS on the sidewalk replacement. Our MFT funds approved for this fiscal year was \$14,810. Kenny stated he can either rework the bid to get the price down, or we can cover the extra \$3,750.00. Mayor Reynolds stated to go ahead and do it.
- Kenny pulled the manhole covers on the highway and could not get any numbers off them. We will have to call IDOT.
- Trustee Smith asked if Doerr and East Tydeman handicap access to the sidewalk and curb ramps are part of this year's project? Mayor Reynolds stated they are not part of this project.
