Remembering James W. "Jim" Loyd

Randy and Virginia Clark along with their children, Carey & David Price and Kristin & Matt Maberry, plus extended family members Vera Clark, Georgia Salzman, and Cheryl Clark-Way have dedicated a mighty oak tree in honor of James Loyd, who stood as a mighty oak for the Village of Roxana and it's residents. Jim's integrity combined with his dedication and empathy were exemplified by the numerous positions he held within and for Roxana. Our family always knew Jim was ready and willing to assist us and others in any manner he could. What a great neighbor, friend, and mentor he was!

Jim worked for the Village of Roxana in every department, including the Library Board and the Park Board. He became a police officer, serving 33 years, 17 years as Chief. He was later elected mayor and served multiple terms as trustee.

Jim Loyd's life was dedicated to family, his church and the citizens of Roxana. He felt particularly drawn to protecting people financially and using refinery tax money responsibly. Jim was drawn to the youth of the community and church. The DARE program was "his baby" and other officers followed his passion. He directed church youth camps, taught riflery and pistolry, and has been touched by some of those young people over the years who have written to say they became police officers because of him.

Community Yard Sale



The Roxana Community Yard Sale will be on Saturday, September 24, 2022, from 7am-2-pm. If you wish to have your address included on the Village Yard Sale map, please notify the Roxana Police Department at 618-254-1945. Yard Sale Permits for the Annual Village Yard Sale will be waived by the Village Board of Trustees.

Any a resident who would like to schedule a different day for a Yard Sale, may obtain a Yard Sale Permit by calling the Roxana Police Department at 618-254-1945, Mon.-Fri. between 8:30 a.m.—4:00 p.m.. After approval, the permit can be picked up at the Roxana Police Department or sent via email to the resident.

Street Department Information

Trash Collection Schedule:

Trash collection days are **Tuesday and Thursday** for residents in most of the village. Residences and businesses located on Cemetery, Wasman, Wanda, Wagon Wheel, Hedge, Canal, Industrial, and Barton roads will have trash collected on Fridays. Visit our website for more information on our refuse ordinances, and which holidays may impact your refuse collection.

Large Item/Bulk Pickup Notice:

The Village has recently placed a large 30-yard dumpster on the Street Department parking lot. The Village is requesting any <u>residents who are able</u>, to bring any large/bulk items they wish to dispose of and place them in this dumpster. The Village defines large/bulk items as: furniture, mattresses, fencing, or any other items that do not fit in a standard residential trash can. If a resident is able to relocate these items, please call the Street Department at **618-254-1951** and schedule a time to place the items in the dumpster. The Dumpster is accessible from **7AM to 3:30PM** on business days. Yard waste and brush are not permitted to be placed in the dumpster. If a resident is unable to relocate large/bulk items, they are asked to place the items in their normal trash collection area, and call the Street Department at **618-254-1951** to schedule a pickup. There are no costs associated with either disposal method.

If a resident has a large quantity of refuse, they may contact the Village to request a temporary dumpster to be placed at their residence. Visit our website for regulations and contact info.

Leaf Collection Notice:

The Roxana Street Department operates a leaf collection program beginning **Oct. 1st and ending Dec. 31st** (weather permitting). During these dates, if residents have any leaves they would like collected, please place them either near your normal trash collection area or in the grass between the sidewalk and the street in front of the residence. Please do not place the leaves in the gutters or streets as they can be washed away by rain and clog our stormwater system. Leaves are collected with heavy equipment and may not be collected if located too close to a building, vehicle, or another obstacle.

This collection is for **leaves only**. If your pile includes sticks, gumballs, grass clippings or any other yard waste, the leaves will not be collected as they can damage the machinery. Please place all other yard waste and grass clippings into biodegradable yard waste bags and place them in your normal trash collection area. Grass clippings and gumballs that are not bagged will not be collected.





Back to School Traffic Safety Tips

Students are back to class for the 2022-2023 school year, which means we will see a lot more activity near schools and on the roads. The Roxana Police Department wants to remind motorists to be extra cautious in school zones, especially around pick up and drop off times. Here are some tips to help ensure safety in these areas and reduce traffic incidents.

- Slowdown in school zones.
- Obey all traffic signals and signs.
- Stay Alert! Avoid distractions behind the wheel.
- Watch for student drivers who may still be learning the rules of the road.
- Yield to school buses.
- Watch for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Be vigilant. If you see something, say something.



The Roxana Police Department evaluates evolving traffic needs around schools throughout the year. A Police Officer responds to areas where there are concerns of repeated violations and/or potential traffic hazards. We appreciate every effort to make Roxana a safe place to learn!

- ♦ Go Trick-or-Treating with a grown-up
- Visit only neighbors you know
- ◊ Make sure your costume lets you move, see, and hear easily
- ◊ Wear a light-colored or bright costume so drivers can see you
- O Put glow-in-the dark patches or strips on your costume
- ♦ Carry a flashlight or glow stick
- Stay in areas that are well lit
- ◊ Watch out for cars
- A Have your parents check your candy before you eat it

Burning Leaves / Campfires / Bonfire Permits

- The burning of leaves or any yard waste is **prohibited** by Village ordinance.
- The burning of felled tree wood for the purpose of a recreation 'campfire' is permitted by Village ordinance; provided that no garbage or any type of construction material is burned in such cases.

Technical Rescue demonstrations Hazardous Materials Truck

• Permits for recreational 'bonfires' shall be issued by the Fire Chief, at his discretion. These permits shall be applied for two weeks in advance of any event. Reasonable conditions shall be verified before any permits will be issued.

Friendly Reminders

- On November 6, 2022 Daylight Savings Time ends and you should move your clock back one hour. The Roxana Fire Department would also like to remind you, this is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Building permits are required and should be obtained prior to remodeling or structure maintenance. There is no charge except for new residential/commercial construction.
- If you plan on leaving town, contact the Roxana Police Department for extra patrol of your residence. This is done as a public service free of charge.
- No dog or cat shall be permitted to run at large in the Village. Any dog or cat found in the Village without a current license tag or running at large shall be deemed a nuisance.
- Animal tags can be purchased for \$5.00 at the Roxana Village Clerk's Office.

Recent Park Improvements

In 2019, the Park District was awarded the Metro East Park & Recreation Grant for partial funding of the renovation of the Lighted Diamond. The renovations included new ball field lighting, covered spectator area, seating, storage and concession stand.

In 2020, Roxana Community Park District announced that they had been awarded the 2020 IPRA/PlayCore playground grant. The new playground is part of the "PLAY ON" initiative including six key elements which promote physical activity and healthy lifestyles for children.

In 2021, Picnic Diamond was upgraded with new LED lighting.

In 2022, the Park District installed updated security cameras and path lightning throughout the park grounds.


Roxana Community Gym

The gym is made available for use by approved groups or organizations for athletic activities. It can only be used for volleyball and basketball.


Roxana Pool
