# Friendly Reminders

- On November 3, 2024 Daylight Savings Time ends and you should move your clock back one hour. The Roxana Fire Department would also like to remind you, this is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Building permits are required and should be obtained prior to remodeling or structure maintenance. There is no charge except for new residential/commercial construction.
- If you plan on leaving town, contact the Roxana Police Department for extra patrol of your residence. This is done as a public service free of charge.
- No dog or cat shall be permitted to run at large in the Village. Any dog or cat found in the Village without a current license tag or running at large shall be deemed a nuisance.
- Animal tags can be purchased for \$5.00 at the Roxana Village Clerk's Office.
- The Village of Roxana hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Residents wishing to pay their water bill outside business hours will have access to the drop box which is located on the exterior of the building near the main entrance doors.
- Any resident who would like to schedule a Yard Sale, may obtain a Yard Sale Permit by calling the Roxana Police Department at 618-254-1945, Mon.-Fri. between 8:30 a.m.—4:00 p.m. After approval, the permit can be picked up at the Roxana Police Department or sent via email to the resident.

# Village Update

The Village is moving forward with a bold and adventurous plan that will replace all the cast iron water mains under our streets and all the galvanized water service lines to each home in the Village. The logistics and effort required to move this forward is mind boggling. It's always easier to build new than replace, but we are in the middle of it all with our 100-year-old infrastructure. The Water Department has been working with our consulting engineers for the last year on this plan and we hope to be close to finalizing the details this spring on how to proceed. We have secured nine million dollars of USDA loan money to use on the project, but we are actively working to "massage" that number down. In addition, to the water mains and water service line replacements, we will be resurfacing all the existing oil and chipped streets with Type II "permanent asphalt surface" roadways after the water system improvements have been completed. This will add another 5 million dollars to the project, but something the residents have requested over the past several years. The water main replacement and road resurfacing must go hand in hand. Thank you to those residents who have returned the Access Agreements our Water Department has handed out related to this project. There are still some residents who need to return that information and please contact us if you need help with completing or understanding the nature of the document. The Access Agreement is a requirement by the USDA to allow us to replace your water line. A portion of this project is mandated by the USEPA, requiring each public water supply to replace water service line materials that potentially contain harmful metals. We are taking the opportunity to do all the needed water system and road improvements at one time.



The Village is moving forward with replacing an old concrete road from 7<sup>th</sup> Street south to the railroad tracks. This road was part of the IDOT roadway system through the area years ago and it was given to the Village. It needs some attention. We have received a grant from Madison County to assist with the costs, and this project will begin this spring and take a few weeks to complete.


The Thomas and Doerr Street Drainage Improvement project is wrapping up. We have planned this project over the past three years hoping to link up grant funding cycles and the school being out of session, but we finally just moved forward with the project this spring as the grant funding cycles and school activities never matched up. The drainage revision to this area includes 6 new stormwater inlets, 250 feet of new stormwater piping and new curb and gutter with revised accessibility sidewalk improvements. It's been a complicated and cumbersome project as it separates a portion of the old existing stormwater system from an antiquated Illinois Department of Transportation stormwater collection system under Route 111. This new stormwater collection system will re-direct a majority of the stormwater in this area to a Village collection system we installed under Chaffer Avenue a few years ago. I apologize for the inconvenience of the project to the residents in this area, but there should be no more flooding concerns at the Doerr and Thomas Intersection in the future.





# Village Update Continued

One of the biggest accomplishments to date of our Village Administration is this year, we have posted the lowest corporate tax rate that I can find in the history of Roxana. This has been a goal for years. It's good for our residents and businesses that we effectively manage the Village in a manner that allows our tax rate to be the lowest in the region. Tax talk can get technical, and your tax bill may have gone up, but not because of the Village of Roxana. Listed below is a comparison of our surrounding communities and their corporate tax rates.



Last, but not least, In April the Village added a new staff person at Village Hall. Mr. Jason Woody was hired to handle Village wide administrative duties. Jason comes to us with 15 years of local government experience and has been effective already in securing grant funding for home demolitions and other projects. People think of Roxana as a small community, but in reality we are one of a few communities our size in the State of Illinois that provide the "in house" service that we do. Economically speaking, with income and expense, Roxana is a 14 million dollar a year operation. We strive to operate the Village in the most efficient way possible and with that in mind, we all win! Jason will help keep the Village moving in that direction.

Not only is the Village continuing to improve the infrastructure throughout the community, but we are also adding some growth and development in locations south of Madison Avenue.

Ameren Electric has added a maintenance location and facilities yard on Wanda Road

A self-storage facility has been through our permitting process and is in the design stage. This new development is also located on Wanda Road. Construction is anticipated late this fall.

A large-scale maintenance center owned and operated by a group called E-Tank has recently purchased 10 acres of property east of Hedge Road and west of I-255. The drawings we have reviewed on this development are impressive and it will certainly be a welcome addition to this part of Roxana.

There are two more potentially large-scale developments in the planning stages along Hedge Road. Information is still being acquired about the sites and questions are being addressed on how the Village may assist with these new businesses. I anticipate more to be known later this fall.

On a personal note, I'm glad fall is almost here. It's my favorite time of the year! I have tried to provide an update on our community, but there is too much detail involved and too much happening to cover it all in a newsletter. If you would like to discuss Roxana in more detail, please reach out to me at Village Hall and we certainly "talk" more.

# Burning Leaves / Campfires / Bonfire Permits

- The burning of leaves or any yard waste is prohibited by Village ordinance.
- The burning of felled tree wood for the purpose of a recreation 'campfire' is permitted by Village ordinance; provided that no garbage or any type of construction material is burned in such cases.
- Permits for recreational 'bonfires' shall be issued by the Fire Chief, at his discretion. These permits shall be applied for two weeks in advance of any event. Reasonable conditions shall be verified before any permits will be issued.

# New Ordinance—Amending Parking Regulation Code: (No Parking in Front or Side Yard)

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Roxana, Illinois, previously adopted Section 3 of Chapter 5 of Title VII Code of Ordinances, defining and setting forth general parking restrictions for the Village of Roxana, Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Trustees has reviewed certain provisions of Code 7-5-3 and has determined that updates and modifications to certain components thereof are in order.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROXANA, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** That Section 3 of Chapter 5 of Title VII of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Roxana shall be amended by adding the following subsections to the existing provisions of Section 3:

- "F. For purposes of this section only, a "side yard" is defined as a space extending from the front yard to the rear yard between the principal building and the side lot line, measured perpendicular from the side lot line to the closest point of the principal building."
- "G. All vehicles in any SR-I or MR-I district parked in a front or side yard shall be on an improved surface. Any vehicles which are subject to Illinois Secretary of State licensure shall have a current Illinois registration with the Illinois Secretary of State's Office."
- "H. An "improved surface" as used herein is defined as a continuous surface construction of concrete, blacktop, or paving stone, which is complete and uninterrupted underneath all portions of the vehicle being placed on the surface."
  - "I. Drainage easements shall not be encroached upon by such improved surfaces or vehicles."

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall be in effect upon its adoption, execution, and publication as provided for by law.

SECTION 3: No part of this Ordinance shall be deemed to modify or otherwise alter any other provision or section of Chapter 5 of Title VII.

# Street Department Information

### **Trash Collection Schedule:**

Please note that by ordinance, refuse must be bagged, placed inside a container, and kept under control to prevent scattering by the elements, animals, or people. It is unlawful for any person to bring refuse into the village for the purpose of placing it for disposal by the village. Containers must be approved by the Street Department. Trash collection days are **Tuesday and Thursday** for residents in most of the village. Residences and businesses located on Cemetery, Wasman, Wanda, Wagon Wheel, Hedge, Canal, Industrial, and Barton roads will have trash collected on Fridays. Visit our website <u>roxana-il.org</u> for more information.

### Leaf Vac Program Notice:

The Roxana Street Department operates a leaf collection program beginning **Oct. 1st and ending Dec.**31st (weather permitting). During these dates, if residents have any leaves they would like collected, please place them either near your normal trash collection area or in the grass between the sidewalk and the street in front of the residence. Please do not place the leaves in the gutters or streets as they can be washed away by rain and clog our stormwater system. Leaves are collected with heavy equipment and may not be collected if located too close to a building, vehicle, or another obstacle.

This collection is for <u>leaves only</u>. If your pile includes sticks, gumballs, grass clippings or any other yard waste, the leaves will not be collected as they can damage the machinery. Please place all other yard waste and grass clippings into biodegradable yard waste bags and place them in your normal trash collection area. Grass clippings and gumballs that are not bagged will not be collected.



### Snow Removal:

Please try to remove vehicles from the roadways during a snow event when possible so that the street can be cleaned curb to curb. Failure to do so may result in your vehicle being buried during heavy snowfalls. It is suggested that residents wait until the streets have been fully cleared of snow before clearing their driveways. Failure to do so may result in the driveway approach being reburied.

### Large Item/Bulk Pickup Notice:

The Village has recently placed a large 30-yard dumpster on the Street Department parking lot. The Village is requesting any <u>residents who</u> <u>are able</u>, to bring any large/bulk items they wish to dispose of and place them in this dumpster. The Village defines large/bulk items as: furniture, mattresses, fencing, or any other items that do not fit in a standard residential trash can. If a resident is able to relocate these items, please call the Street Department at 618-254-1951 and schedule a time to place the items in the dumpster. The Dumpster is accessible from 7AM to 3:30PM on business days. Yard waste and brush are not permitted to be placed in the dumpster.

# Back to School Traffic Safety Tips

Students are back to class for the 2024-2025 school year, which means we will see a lot more activity near schools and on the roads. The Roxana Police Department wants to remind motorists to be extra cautious in school zones, especially around pick up and drop off times. Here are some tips to help ensure safety in these areas and reduce traffic incidents.

- Slowdown in school zones.
- Obey all traffic signals and signs.
- Stay Alert! Avoid distractions behind the wheel.
- Watch for student drivers who may still be learning the rules of the road.
- Yield to school buses.
- Watch for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Be vigilant. If you see something, say something.

# Phillips 66 Refinery

### Dear Roxana Residents:

We know sometimes you may have questions or concerns about the refinery operations. We encourage anyone who has a concern about an odor, noise, or something you are seeing, to call our Community Concern Line at 618-255-3375. This phone line is answered 24/7 and will help our team immediately look into your concern and identify if we can make changes in our operation to address it. While we know people often seek answers on social media – most of the time, we can't see these conversations so we cannot address the problem.

We often get questions about our alarms people hear. A few things you should know. The refinery alarm systems are tested on Fridays, similar to how the region tests tornado sirens once a month. Not all alarms are tested each week, so you may not hear these alarms on some Fridays depending on where you are. The alarms start with a siren-type alert followed by verbal instructions. Neighbors often express concern because they can't hear the verbal instructions. Please note that these instructions are for the employees in the operating areas of the refinery. They are not intended to be heard wide-spread throughout the community. If there was ever a need to provide instructions to our community residents, it is important to know that those instructions would come from your Roxana Police and Fire Department and Madison County's Code Red system which would provide clear instructions to all.

You may be aware that the refinery has its own fire department and emergency responders. Our ER teams have extensive training and we have even taken members of your fire department to specialized training schools. One thing you may see occasionally is smoke from our fire training grounds inside the refinery. This year, we will be doing fire training with live burns on Tuesday from October 15<sup>th</sup> to November 19<sup>th</sup>. You may see smoke in the southeast region of the refinery periodically on these days. That is part of the training with our ER team members.

Finally, we have a Community Advisory Panel (CAP) that meets with us once a month. This team includes key management members from the refinery, residents, and stakeholders from our fence line communities. The panel learns about refinery topics each month and also sponsors events like the free Party in the Park that was hosted on July 18<sup>th</sup>. Panel members from your community are Will Cunningham, Judy Loyd, Alex Best, Dustin McCann, Chris White, and Roxana Teachers David Watts and Breanna Minogue. If you ever have questions that you don't want to submit directly to the refinery, have a conversation with these CAP members and they can bring your questions or concerns to us.

Phillips 66 is proud to operate in the Village of Roxana. I hope that if you have questions you will let us know.
