Burbank Park Update

In 2020 the Roxana Community Park District created a Comprehensive Master Plan to reveal desired changes and needs throughout the District's parks. The Park District conducted several surveys of residents and community stakeholders and hosted an open house to gain a better understanding of potential upgrades that would ultimately make the Roxana Parks as successful and well-used as possible.

In the Fall of 2022 the Roxana park district utilized the information gathered in the initial master plan to develop a clear vision of what Burbank Park could become. The Roxana park district wanted to create a park plan that embraces the existing location in the heart of the Village of Roxana to respond to the needs of the residents.

In March of 2025 the Roxana park district announced they would be breaking ground for the upcoming Burbank Park Project. The Burbank Park Project will happen in phases and should feature the following upgrades:.

- Playground Equipment
- Sidewalks
- Gazebo
- Dog Run

- Restrooms
- Shelter Building/Pavilion
- Basketball Half Court
- 2 Pickleball Courts
- Open Space/Soccer Area
- Ornamental Fence
- Extended Parking Lot
- Park Amenities



Village Update

As I start my third term as Village President, I remain committed to operating the village in the most economical matter possible, while providing more municipal services to our corporate citizens than any other community in our region. I thank the voters who placed their trust in me to lead the Village forward the next four years. Preliminary audit reports from last fiscal year indicate money in and money out totaled over \$15.8 million dollars. Roxana is not a small operation in terms of land mass, services provided, or income and expenses. I am proud of who we are, what we do, and most appreciative to all our departments and employees who make Roxana the community, I am proud to call my home.

We are working through the final details of our water system re-development project and plans. Our water system consists of approximately 17 miles of water mains and 700 residential service lines. The US EPA has mandated we replace any water service line that may at some point been in contact with lead. This means each water service line in the Village that has not been replaced within the last 40 years. The project will have the Village installing new water mains and service lines to at least each property line. The EPA states that we need to replace service lines all the way into each residence. However, we must have a signed ACCESS AGREEMENT FROM THE PROEPRTY OWNER TO WORK PAST THE VILLAGE RIGHT OF WAY. WE NEED YOUR HELP! IF YOU HAVE NOT SIGNED AN ACCESS AGREEMENT, PLEASE DO SO, OR CONTACT US FOR ASSISTANCE IN SUBMITITING THE FORM.

There is the possibility that the EPA will put the responsibility of lead mitigation in service lines on property owners in the future. Costs to install new service lines into each home are estimated to be between 3 thousand to 7 thousand dollars per line. The Village of Roxana is willing to do this for each water customer as part of the project. If your water meter is inside your home, it will be moved outside and read remotely after the project is completed. This could potentially help us to identify any leaks or higher than normal usage at all hours of the day and or night. It may help to reduce water usage costs that may be related to leaks that are undetected until you receive your water bill. Construction is anticipated to start in early spring of 2026, but we need to have all the paperwork submitted to the United States Department of Agriculture by October of this year. Please don't miss this opportunity for a new water line at the Village's expense.

The Village of Roxana continues to work on improving the conditions of our neighborhoods. Recently two more homes have been purchased and removed to help clean up various properties.







Please help us improve the Village by keeping your property maintained and in good condition. We are starting an enhanced code enforcement of our ordinances that addresses the appearance and living conditions in our town. Help us be more efficient with our employees' time by not having to send citations and pester our citizens with property maintenance issues. We are working hard to maintain the appearance of the Village, and we ask you to please do the same.

I want to acknowledge the passing of a dear friend and a great asset to the Village of Roxana. Mr. George Willaredt passed into eternity July 28th. Most people have no continuity of Roxana's developmental stage that began in the late 80's when the concept of I-255 became "big news". The Willaredt Family was forefront in the mix when FAP 310, later named I-255 was being planned. George and his family owned several hundred acres of property that was going to be spilt by the interstate as it moved through then unincorporated Madison County, but soon to become a part of Roxana with George's help and guidance. The Willaredt Family was approached by several other communities about annexing Willaredt Property into various communities. As plans for the interstate were progressing, land annexation was important as it related to potential growth and development around the new interstate. Geroge and his family chose to annex their property into Roxana.

There are too many stories and memories from that time to mention. I will say it was a privilege to have been a part of "those days" and I enjoyed working with George, his family, and several Village Presidents that had the foresight to follow George's willingness to allow Roxana to grow and develop on Willaredt Land. Roxana's economic stability today is in part due to George Willaredt and the relationship that was developed between his family and our community. Rest in peace my friend. You and the Willaredt Family will always be a part of Roxana's past, present, and future.

I am ready for a change in the season, and the next year of Roxana High School football is set to begin. Best of luck and good wishes to all our residents this fall. If you have issues or concerns with our Village, please reach out to me at Village Hall.

Notice: Village Trash Receptacles Update

The Village of Roxana is pleased to announce an upgrade to our residential waste collection service. To improve sanitation, reduce litter, and streamline weekly pickups, the Village will be providing all households with new 95-gallon wheeled trash receptacles. These durable containers offer greater capacity, easier handling, and improved functionality—helping to keep our streets and alleys cleaner and more organized.

Key Details

Delivery: Receptacles will be delivered beginning the week of **October 6**, **2025**. Start of Use: Begin using the new container immediately upon receipt.

Free Old Receptacle Collection

To assist with the transition, the Village will offer free pickup of old trash containers for the entire month of October:

- Place your old can(s) out on your regular collection day.
- Clearly mark them 'DISCARD' so our crews know to remove them.
- Old containers CANNOT remain in the right of way, if they are not removed by November 30th, they will be disposed of.

Important Collection Requirements

- All trash must be placed inside the provided Village-issued receptacle.
- Loose trash or trash in another container will not be collected.
- Failure to comply will result in a notice to abate, a 2nd offense could result in an ordinance violation.
- Biodegradable yard waste bags should be used for yard waste. Place your yard waste bags in your normal collection area or into the Village-issued receptacle.
- Large Items are considered anything that will not fit into the Village-issued receptacle. For more information on rules, including large item pickup regulations, visit our website: www.roxana-il.org.

Need a Second Receptacle?

If your household generates extra waste, you may purchase one additional 95-gallon container for \$50:

- Visit Village Hall to purchase an additional receptacle.
- Limit: One additional receptacle per household.


Notice: Village Recycling Bin Update

Republic Services will no longer provide the blue recycling bins currently in use. These bins will be replaced with a **32-gallon recycling cart**.

If you currently participate in the recycling program, your blue bin will be replaced with a new cart in the coming months.

If you wish to begin utilizing Republic Services' recycling program, please request a cart by calling Village Hall at **618-254-0345** and we will deliver one to you in your normal collection area.

Friendly Reminders

- On November 2, 2025 Daylight Savings Time ends and you should move your clock back one hour. The Roxana Fire Department would also like to remind you, this is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Building permits are required and should be obtained prior to remodeling or structure maintenance. There is no charge except for new residential/commercial construction.
- If you plan on leaving town, contact the Roxana Police Department for extra patrol of your residence. This is done as a public service free of charge.
- No dog or cat shall be permitted to run at large in the Village. Any dog or cat found in the Village without a current license tag or running at large shall be deemed a nuisance.
- Animal tags can be purchased for \$5.00 at the Roxana Village Clerk's Office.
- The Village of Roxana hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Residents wishing to pay their water bill outside business hours will have access to the drop box which is located on the exterior of the building near the main entrance doors.
- Any resident who would like to schedule a Yard Sale, may obtain a Yard Sale Permit by calling the Roxana Police Department at 618-254-1945, Mon.-Fri. between 8:30 a.m.—4:00 p.m. After approval, the permit can be picked up at the Roxana Police Department or sent via email to the resident.

New Ordinance—Amending Parking Regulation Code: (No Parking in Front or Side Yard)

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Roxana, Illinois, previously adopted Ordinance #910, which contains certain details related to residential parking on certain streets within the Village of Roxana, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has reviewed certain provisions of Ordinance #910 and has determined that updates and modifications to certain components thereof are in order.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROXANA, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: The above recitals are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2: That Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Ordinance #910 shall be amended to read as follows:

"SECTION I.

The following residential streets or portions thereof are hereby designated for resident parking in accordance with the requirements and procedures set out in this Ordinance:

West Side of Chaffer Avenue from East Tydeman Avenue to East Thomas Street. South Side of East Thomas Avenue from Chaffer Avenue to Doerr Street. North Side of East Thomas Avenue from Chaffer Avenue to Doerr Street.

Designated parking areas will be marked with white paint along the curbside. Prohibited parking areas will be marked with yellow paint along the curbside.

It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any vehicle to be parked in a designated residential parking area unless the vehicle is registered to the designated property owner. A residential parking permit shall not be required; however, a vehicle registration to the property owner is mandatory between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 pm on a day when school children are present. It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any vehicle to be parked in a prohibited parking area at any given time.

Section 2.

A. In addition, each home in the designated area shall be entitled to receive two Temporary Parking Permits, which may be used by immediate family members not designated as property owner, including children, parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and guests. The purpose of the Temporary Permit is to accommodate relatives of affected property owner(s) on occasional visits of relatively short duration. Abuse of this Temporary Permit may be a basis for termination of such Temporary Permit.

B. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to apply to commercial vehicles making deliveries or providing services to the affected homes.

Section 3.

The penalty for violation of this Ordinance shall be a fine of \$25.00 for the first offense; \$50.00 for the second offense in a twelve-moth period; and \$100.00 for a third and each additional offense in a twelve-month period. In addition to any monetary penalty, the offending vehicle is subject to being towed at the owner's or operator's expense. "

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in effect upon its adoption, execution, and publication as provided for by law.

Burning Leaves / Campfires / Bonfire Permits

- The burning of leaves or any yard waste is **prohibited** by Village ordinance.
- The burning of felled tree wood for the purpose of a recreation 'campfire' is permitted by Village ordinance; provided that no garbage or any type of construction material is burned in such cases.
- Permits for recreational 'bonfires' shall be issued by the Fire Chief, at his discretion. These permits shall be applied for two weeks in advance of any event. Reasonable conditions shall be verified before any permits will be issued.

Community Yard Sale

The Roxana Community Yard Sale will be on Saturday, September 27, 2025, from 7am-2-pm. If you wish to have your address included on the Village Yard Sale map, please notify the Roxana Police Department at 618-254-1945. Yard Sale Permits for the Annual Village Yard Sale will be waived by the Village Board of Trustees.

Street Department Information

Trash Collection Schedule:

It is unlawful for any person to bring refuse into the village for the purpose of placing it for disposal by the village. Containers must be approved by the Village. Starting the week of October 6, 2025, trash collection days are Mondays and Thursdays (previously Tuesdays and Thursdays for residents in most of the village. Residences and businesses located on Cemetery, Wasman, Wanda, Wagon Wheel, Hedge, Canal, Industrial, and Barton roads will have trash collected on Fridays. Visit our website <u>roxana-il.org</u> for more information.

Leaf Vac Program Notice:

The Roxana Street Department operates a leaf collection program beginning **Oct. Ist and ending Dec. 31st** (weather permitting). During these dates, if residents have any leaves they would like collected, please place them either near your normal trash collection area or in the grass between the sidewalk and the street in front of the residence.

Please do not place the leaves in the gutters or streets as they can be washed away by rain and clog our

stormwater system. Leaves are collected with heavy equipment and may not be collected if located too close to a building, vehicle, or another obstacle.

This collection is for <u>leaves only</u>. If your pile includes sticks, gumballs, grass clippings or any other yard waste, the leaves will not be collected as they can damage the machinery. Please place all other yard waste and grass clippings into biodegradable yard waste bags and place them in your normal trash collection area. Grass clippings and gumballs that are not bagged will not be collected.



Snow Removal:

Please try to remove vehicles from the roadways during a snow event when possible so that the street can be cleaned curb to curb. Failure to do so may result in your vehicle being buried during heavy snowfalls. It is suggested that residents wait until the streets have been fully cleared of snow before clearing their driveways. Failure to do so may result in the driveway approach being reburied.



Phillips 66 Refinery

Dear Roxana Residents:

A few fun facts about the Phillips 66 Wood River Refinery:

- The refinery was built in 1917; the name Roxana Refinery came from the first plant manager's wife, who liked the name Roxana. Taking its name from the refinery, the Village of Roxana later incorporated around the refinery's fence line.
- This refinery can produce your lifetime of fuel in 9 minutes or less.
- The steam plumes you see rising in the center of the refinery are not smoke or pollution, but steam and part of an environmental technology or pollution control device used to "scrub" or remove harmful gases and particles from the exhaust stream before it's released into the air.

If you have questions or concerns about the refinery—maybe there's an unusual odor, noise, or something looks off—please call our Community Concern Line at 618-255-3375 any time, day or night. This direct line helps us quickly look into your concern and, when possible, make adjustments. We know social media is a popular way to share questions, but we can't always see those posts. Calling us directly is the best way to get answers or help.


About alarms: The refinery routinely tests its alarm systems on Fridays, similar to the region's tornado sirens. You might not hear every alarm every week, depending on where you are. The alarms start with a siren followed by verbal instructions meant for refinery employees onsite, not for the community. If there's ever a real emergency that affects residents, information will come from the Roxana Police and Fire Department and Madison County's Code Red system.

You might also see smoke coming from the refinery's fire training grounds. That's just our emergency response teams keeping their skills sharp. This year, live fire training is scheduled for Tuesdays through the fall into early winter, so expect to see some smoke around the southeast part of the refinery on those days. Our specialty-trained Emergency Response teams also work with your local fire department – including inviting them to train with the refinery team and covering the cost of their attendance at the Texas A&M Fire School.

Finally, our Community Advisory Panel (CAP) meets monthly with refinery leaders, local residents, and stakeholders. The panel discusses refinery topics. Community CAP members include Will Cunningham, Alex Best, Dustin McCann, Chris White, and Roxana teacher Breanna Minogue. If you'd rather not contact us directly, feel free to reach out to one of them—they'll make sure your voice is heard. The CAP is again sponsoring the Party in the Park on Thursday, September 11th from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Roxana Park. This is a completely free event for residents. We will have inflatables, games, food and giveaways. We will also have a booth to answer questions about the refinery.
